LIGH.

The Triangle Palm thrives in bright, indirect light. It can tolerate some direct sunlight, but too much can scorch its leaves. If placed in low light, its growth may slow, and the fronds may not develop as fully.



SOII

For Palm trees mix 2/3 Rooted Goods All-Purpose Potting Mix or Uncle Mike's Organic Potting Mix and 1/3 coarse gardening sand. Alternatively, you can use Espoma's Organic Cactus mix.



WATER

The Triangle Palm prefers moderate watering. Allow the top 1-2 inches of soil to dry out before watering again. Be sure to water thoroughly, ensuring that the water drains out of the bottom of the pot. It's important not to let the plant sit in standing water, as this can lead to root rot.



FERTILIZER

We recommend fertilizers like Espoma Organic Palm Food, Jack's Houseplant Special, or Organic Plant Magic. These options provide essential nutrients to keep your plants vibrant and thriving.



TEMPERATURE

The Triangle Palm prefers warm temperatures between 65-85°F (18-29°C). It thrives in a warm, tropical environment and should be kept away from cold drafts. The plant is not frost-tolerant, so avoid exposing it to temperatures below 50°F (10°C).



ISSUES + FIXES

Watch for common pests like mealybugs, scale, and mites. Regularly inspect your plant for signs of infestation and treat promptly with natural or chemical remedies.



PRUNING & PROPAGATION

Prune the Triangle Palm by removing dead or damaged leaves and trimming any leggy growth to maintain its shape. Use sharp, clean scissors to cut yellow or brown fronds at the base. Avoid overpruning, as the plant doesn't require heavy cutting. Regularly removing unwanted growth helps keep the palm healthy and attractive.
