LIGHT

Angel Vine thrives in bright, indirect light and can tolerate some direct sunlight, such as morning or late afternoon light. However, avoid harsh midday sun, as it can scorch the delicate leaves. If placed in lower light conditions, the plant may grow slower and appear less vibrant.



SOIL

For tropical plants, we recommend using our Rooted Goods All-Purpose Potting Mix, Uncle Mike's Organic Potting Mix, or Espoma's Organic Potting Mix. All three options are great choices for ensuring healthy growth and thriving plants.



WATER

Water the Angel Vine when the top 1 inch of soil feels dry, but avoid letting the soil dry out completely, as this may cause leaf drop. Ensure the pot has proper drainage and always empty the saucer after watering to prevent root rot.



FERTILIZER

We recommend fertilizers like Espoma Organic Indoor! Houseplant Food, Jack's Houseplant Special, or Organic Plant Magic. These options provide essential nutrients to keep your plants vibrant and thriving.



TEMPERATURE

Angel Vine thrives in temperatures between 60-75°F (16-24°C). Avoid exposing it to temperatures below 50°F (10°C), as cold conditions can stress the plant and cause leaf drop. Keep it away from cold drafts, heaters, or air conditioners to maintain a stable and healthy growing environment.



ISSUES + FIXES

These plants may be susceptible to pests such as spider mites, mealybugs, and occasionally scale. Regularly inspect your plant for signs of infestation and treat promptly with natural or chemical remedies.



PRUNING & PROPAGATION

Take a 4-6 inch healthy stem cutting and cut just below a node. Remove the lower leaves to expose the node, and place the cutting in water with the node submerged. Change the water every few days to keep it fresh. Roots should develop within 2-4 weeks. Once the roots are 1-2 inches long, transplant the cutting into soil.
