Money Tree thrives in bright, indirect light. It can tolerate lower light conditions, but its growth will likely slow significantly. The leaves may lose some of their vibrant green color, and the plant could become leggy, stretching toward available light sources. Avoid direct sunlight, as it can scorch the leaves, causing browning or yellowing.

Money Tree prefers soil that is evenly moist but not soggy. Water thoroughly when the top 1-2 inches of soil feel dry to the touch. Allow excess water to drain, and always empty the saucer to prevent root rot.

TEMPERATURE

Maintain temperatures between 60 to 85 degrees Fahrenheit (16 to 29 degrees Celsius) to ensure optimal growth and health for your Pachira Aquatica.



ISSUES + FIXES

Though rarely bothered by pests, new plants should still be inspected for any signs of infestation before introducing them to your home. If pest problems arise, use appropriate pest control methods recommended for indoor plants.



PRUNING & PROPAGATION

Propagation of Money Trees can be done from large seeds, which germinate easily when planted shallowly in moist soil. Ensure even moisture during propagation, misting occasionally, and provide filtered sunlight until new growth appears.



Pachira aquatica is considered non-toxic to pets, making it a safe choice for households with furry friends. However, it's always a good practice to monitor pets around plants to deter ingestion.
