Butterflies

Attracted to flat-topped or clustered flowers with short tubular blooms in red, yellow, orange, pink and purple

Attracted to long tubular flowers in shades of red, yellow, and purple, sometimes visit orange, dark pink, and blue. Plant in clusters, low to high.
