LIGHT

Campanula thrives in bright, indirect light but can also tolerate some direct sunlight. It prefers around 4-6 hours of sunlight each day, especially in the morning or late afternoon. Too much direct midday sun can scorch the delicate leaves. For optimal growth, place it near a bright window with filtered light.



SOIL

For tropical plants, we recommend using our Rooted Goods All-Purpose Potting Mix, Uncle Mike's Organic Potting Mix, or Espoma's Organic Potting Mix. All three options are great choices for ensuring healthy growth and thriving plants.



WATER

Water your Campanula when the top 1-2 inches of soil feel dry. These plants prefer to stay evenly moist, but be careful not to overwater. Ensure your pot has proper drainage and always empty the saucer after watering to prevent root rot.



FERTILIZER

We recommend fertilizers like Espoma Organic Bloom! Super Blossom Booster, Jack's Blossom Booster, or Organic Plant Magic. These options provide essential nutrients to keep your plants vibrant and thriving, and promote flowering.



TEMPERATURE

Campanula prefers cooler temperatures, ideally between 55-70°F (13-21°C). It thrives in moderate conditions, so avoid placing it in hot areas or near heating vents. Temperatures below 50°F (10°C) may slow growth, and exposure to cold drafts can damage the plant.



ISSUES + FIXES

Campanula is relatively pest-resistant but can occasionally attract aphids, mealybugs, or spider mites. Regularly inspect the plant for signs of pests and treat promptly with natural or chemical remedies if spotted. Also, keep an eye out for yellowing or wilting leaves, which could be signs of overwatering.



PRUNING & PROPAGATION

Campanula can be propagated through stem cuttings or division. To propagate by cutting, snip a healthy stem, ensuring you have at least one leaf and node. Place the cutting in a pot with moist soil, and it should root within 2-4 weeks. For division, gently separate clumps and replant the individual sections in separate pots.



PET FRIENDLY ?

Campanula is non-toxic to both cats and dogs, making it safe for homes with pets. However, as with all plants, it's still best to keep it out of reach to avoid potential chewing.
